

# Motorcade Set for Sunday To Mark Opening of New Ambulance Quarters

New headquarters for Greece Volunteer Ambulance Service, Inc., at 867 Long Pond Road will be officially unveiled Sunday with an open house program from 3 to 8 p. m.

A motorcade will get underway at 2 p. m. to herald the event. Town officials, representatives of community groups and officers of the ambulance service will ride in the procession, which will form at the Town Hall.

Special guests will include Supervisor Gordon A. Howe, Sheriff Albert W. Skinner, Police Chief Milton H. Carter, Elbert Angevine, publisher of The Greater Greece Press; the Rev. Morris Wilson of Trinity Church of the Nazarene and the Rev. Father Shamon of St. Lawrence Catholic Church.

The committee for the open house program is headed by Walter L. Whelehan, with George Germeroth Jr. and Fred Di Nardo as co-chairmen. Fred E. Strauss, president of Greece Volunteer

Ambulance Service, Inc., and his staff also are on the committee.

The Greece Olympia High School Band will present a half-hour concert at the Town Hall before the start of the motorcade tour.

There will be a brief dedicatory ceremony at 3 p. m. at the ambulance quarters.

The Greece Volunteer ambulance serves residents of the western section of the town, primarily those living in the Greece-Ridge and North Greece fire districts.
